Behavioural Science has been used in most health and safety management systems (HSMS) and by most safety professionals for decades. Yet this process has not been well understood and many have not applied a *behavioural* label to their actions.

As an example, organisations that have punishment or reward systems are using a classic *behaviourist* approach, which underpinned management systems from the early twentieth century. Heinrich's work in the 1930s saw workers as the major cause of trouble in HSMS systems and suggested that over ninety per cent of workplace accidents were caused by human error.

In the twenty first century writers such as Sydney Dekker and James Reason, using a social psychological approach have challenged this *behaviourist* interpretation of human safety behaviour. They disagree that accident/incidents should be blamed on *worker error* or that HSMS systems are inherently safe. As Dekker puts it - are workers really just a *problem to control* or should they be seen more as a *resource to harness*?

This seminar will explore some of these ideas and suggest new ways to empower your **health and safety management system** looking at what to target and what you, as a leaders should be doing to accidents and incidents in your business. It is aimed at delegates who have either a management responsibility for implementing safety initiatives or safety advisors in smaller organisations, who are new to the subject.

The presenter, Alan Bartholomew has worked as a trainer with RoSPA for many years. As a result of his background in social psychology, he specialises in behavioural safety
